John Rust is the founder of The Psychometrics Centre and an Associate Fellow of the Leverhulme Centre for the Future of Intelligence. He is also a Senior Member of Darwin College. John combines a huge academic and intellectual reputation in the field of testing and assessment with practical applications experience in a range of blue chips. He retired from his role as Director of the Centre in March 2019.

John has a very broad interest in all aspects of both pure and applied psychometrics, whether it be academic research or challenging business applications. His work ranges from the investigation of advanced statistical and computational techniques for use in test development, to the UK standardisations of widely used psychometric tests such as:

The Watson-Glaser Critical Thinkling Appraisal (WG-CTA)

The NEO PI-R and the BIP personality tests the Wechsler scales of childrens' intelligence (WISC-IV, WPPSI-III, WIAT-II)



Paper of the Month: People who need people

Professor John Rust, City Insights Lecture, London, July 2006

Introduction

Thank you for coming to this lecture "People who need people" I am delighted to have been invited by the Vice-Chancellor to talk on this subject because, since my appointment at City University, people have asked me no end of questions about what psychometrics is, what it does, whether it works, and is it ethical. I appreciate the opportunity to address some of these issues in public.

As you know, psychometrics has become an increasingly controversial subject in recent years, not just in human resources but in society generally. I would like to begin by viewing psychometrics as it might appear from the point of view of the man or woman in the street. What are their impressions and concerns likely to be? Well, there are several. First of all, their knowledge of psychometrics is likely to have come from several sources, some personal, some critical, and some esoteric. They will have read articles in the press and will probably have completed questionnaires in magazines. They will have seen quiz shows on TV. But, perhaps more importantly, their impressions will be based on their own experiences of being assessed. They will have sat examinations at school and possibly at University, and will very likely have completed psychometric tests when applying for jobs. All of these experiences will almost certainly have affected their lives in important ways. Hence, the proverbial man in the street is unlikely to be neutral about the use of psychometric tests.

On the basis of all this, how is he likely to react when invited to take a psychometric test as part of a recruitment programme? Well, he will almost certainly be apprehensive. If it is an ability test that he is about to take, he will worry about not doing well. First he will think back to previous tests that he has done, in particular his GCSE and A Level examinations taken at school. He will begin to consider how he should prepare for the test. Many sources are often available for such preparation although not all are helpful. I once read a book, an Almanac written in India, intended to provide useful advice to job applicants. To the question "What do I need to do to do well on an ability test?" the reply was "Ability tests are not difficult, all you need is a quick mind and a good intelligence". I think you would agree that this is not particularly helpful.

For the candidate asked to take a personality test, the concerns will be different. He may think "Does this mean that they will be able to read my mind, to know what I'm thinking?" He will think about aspects of his character that might make him unsuitable for the job. And he will wonder about how much they could actually find out. And, of course, his attention will turn to ways in which he might be able to cover some things up. He will ask himself what he should do to present himself in the best light, and what he should say or not say.

Once the whole assessment process has been completed, whether he succeeds or fails in his job application, he will be left with many questions unanswered. Did he fail because he was too honest? Can psychometric testing truly allow for his individuality?

Did the assessment fail to take account of the fact that English was his second language, or that he had a disability such as dyslexia? Did he succeed just through luck or because he cheated? And how did his score compare with that of other candidates? And these concerns are not just his concerns, but also those of the selection panel and, ultimately, of the psychometricians who design and maintain the tests and questionnaires themselves. What answers can we provide?






Prof Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle takes over at NCCE

Prof Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle was appointed the Executive Secretary of the National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE), by President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR on 14th April, 2021.

Prof Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle had his first degree in Technical Education from Rivers State University of Science and Technology, Port Harcourt in 1987. He worked for some years before he proceeded for his Masters Degree in 1995 in University of Nigeria, Nsukka, where he studied Industrial Technical Education. Prof Paulinus Okwelle went back to Rivers State University where he obtained a Postgraduate Diploma certificate in Electrical Engineering. In year 2011, he was awarded a PhD in Technical Education in Nnamdi Azikwe University, Awka, Anambra State.



Prof Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle was first appointed an Assistant Lecturer in College of Education Port Hacourt in 1988. Following his tenacity and positive attitude to work, he got promoted to Lecturer III within the space of 3 years. He continued to rise along the career cadre till he was appointed the Executive Secretary of NCCE. By this time, he was already a Professor.

Prof Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle has held various administrative positions within and outside educational institution. This includes Head of Department, Department of Science and Technical Education between 2015 and 2017, Coordinator, Technical Education Studies, 2005 and 2015, Coordinator, Faculty Postgraduate Studies Programme between 2011 and 2015, among others. Prof. Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle has over 40 international and local publications. This includes peered reviewed articles, single authored papers as well as chapters in books.

He has also presented conference papers locally and internationally. He has many other awards of excellence and community services. Prof. Paulinus Chijioke Okwelle's pedigree as an administrator, team player and brilliancy afforded him the opportunity to be appointed the Executive Secretary for NCCE in order to contribute his quota to further development of the commission.

A Professor of Chemical Engineering, Professor Bugaje was born at Bugaje, Katsina State. He had his early education in Katsina before proceeding to the famous




He received the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Award in the United Kingdom from 1990 to 1993 where he studied Energy Engineering at the University of Newcastle Upon-Tyne, for his PhD.

Professor Bugaje had three years' work experience in Industry before joining academia in 1983. He grew from an Assistant Research Fellow (Renewable Energy) to become a Professor in Chemical Engineering in 2006 with over 15 years in Management positions in the last 35 years, having served as CEO three times in Research Institute and Polytechnic sectors. Besides holding Deanship of Engineering in two Universities and Headship of Chemical Engineering departments twice, he has also held about 5 patents and has previously domesticated in Nigeria some technologies from Asia, such as ongoing commercial scale production of tomatoes paste.

Professor Bugaje is said to be a team player with experience in working with people from diverse backgrounds, little wonder he was appointed Rector of Kaduna Polytechnic to clean up the mess that had slowed down progress in that institution over the past years.

As the 6th Executive Secretary of NBTE, Professor Bugaje is expected to provide the necessary leadership needed to turn around the fortunes of the Board.

AYANGALU and the Arrival of Enigma



"Of all the numerous attempts to define poetry, the general consensus is to consider this art form as the advanced reflection of a mind in passionate dialogue with itself and others, using the best of emotive words to describe the image of events, conditions, moments, landscapes, feelings and all other images that are capable of being imagined. A poet is therefore more than a creature; he creates and re-creates ideas through images, in rhythms, and in colours perceptible. When he does, the quality of his imagination is the quality of the uniqueness of his artifice, his literary product.

Metaphorically speaking, contemporary Nigerian poetry is a forest of thorns and flowers, with varying degrees of

brilliance, dalliance and dullness. Now and then, a new collection of poetry appears and rarely gets properly dissected and introduced to its potential consumers.

My encounter with Abimbola Davis's third collection – Ayangalu– is proof that so much is ongoing in the field and a critic needs a lot of catching up to do in order to engage with the pace and location of the literary tradition. For this is a work of considerable talent and rigour.

Here is a poet steeped in the beauty of measured thoughts, whose artistic intelligence is both native and alter-native, traditional and modern. The range of his subjects and thematic concerns is wide; yet, he deals with each matter with aplomb and a self-assuredness that comes from years of training and experience." He concluded.
